Kent Demographic

- 480 people are known to KCC as being Deaf without speech.
- Prevalence rates are known to be around 1000
- 444 live in Kent and the remaining are out of County
- Deaf people live across the whole of Kent, but there are particularly higher numbers in Thanet due to the Deaf School being located there for a number of years.
- Approximately 50% live in East Kent with 25% located in West Kent and 25% North Kent.
