

Update on previous tender

- Massive thank you to all of you who have engaged with this process so far
- 190 bed block contract awarded to YMCA Brunel Group and YMCA Dulverton Group
 - 100 beds for children's social care
 - 90 beds for young people deemed 'in priority need'



Somerset perspective

- The profile and needs of children in care has changed over the last five years.
 - Number of teenagers (aged 13 or over) in care rose **by 8.7%** between 2016/17 and 2021/22
 - 61.3% increase in the number of over 16s entering care in the same period
 - As a result **23.1%** (129) are now over 16
 - A further **37.9%** (212) are aged 10-15.
 - Between Aug-19 and Aug-21 **77** 16 and 17 year-olds started to be in care. (36 aged 16 and 41 aged 17)
 - Increase in number of UASC from 10 children to 46 (8% of the CLA population) in the year ending March 2023.
- Increase in young people stepping down from Tier 4 mental health services
- Uncontrolled costs due to challenging market conditions across all care placements
- Developing strategies/partnerships to address demand
 - Edge of care strategy
 - Homelessness and rough sleeper strategy
 - Strategic Partnership Homes & Horizons
 - Launched Staying Close approach
 - New 16+ service to support higher level of need

Principles and Values

- A commitment to providing young people with the right level of support, in the right place at the right time and choice (where we can);
- Building self esteem and foundations for the future, sticking with young people,
- Every young person is an individual stage not age
- Developing independence skills as early as possible
- Supporting young people to build life-long trusted relationships encouraging peer support models and being a part of a community
- System flexibility and agile response to meet need, based on a strengths-based, trauma informed approach;
- Shift in culture, systems, relational practice, ways of working together looking at services through a different lens;
- Partnership/alliance working that demands collaboration and influencing rather than command and control;
- To adopt open book accounting and transparency in all matters; to ensure public money makes a difference for young people
- A commitment and investment in staff support and shared workforce aims
 - Develop staff together shared training opportunities
 - Create better career pathways
 - Integrated management systems that share risk and enable joint decision making;
- Questions to ask ourselves:
 - Would this be good enough for my child?
 - What kind of adult do we enable them to be at 20, 35 and 50?

Introduction to a Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS)

- A DPS is a two-stage procurement tool where new suppliers can join at any time.
- In the initial set-up stage, all suppliers who meet the selection criteria must be admitted to the DPS. In the second stage, all suppliers on the DPS are invited to bid for a specific contract through a competitive process.
- SC will conduct the wholly electronic procedure in accordance with the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 and the Treaty Principles of Proportionality, Transparency, Non-discrimination and Equal Treatment will be followed. Stage one of the DPS will be advertised via Find a Tender Service, Contracts Finder and <u>https://supplierlive.proactisp2p.com</u>




