#### Context



In 2018: (Snapshot in Time)

 45% of possible placements in Devon were being used by placing authorities other than Devon County Council.

15% of beds in Devon were vacant.

 30% of childrens home placements made by DCC, were within Devon

# Children and Young people placed by Devon in a Children's Home




60 young people placed by Devon within a Children's Home. 40% (24) of these young people placed in the 6 months up to June 2018

Of the remaining 36 young people;

33% (20) were in placement for more than a year, and of these 20, 17% of the cohort (10) were in placement for more than 2 years.

Of this group of Children and Young People 62% were male and 38% female
