

# 1819-0613 Older People Mental Health Residential Service

Islington Council invites suitable expressions of interest from suppliers for an Older People Mental Health Residential Service.

#### **Current status / Background**

The service is currently provided at a 12 unit scheme, which is staffed 24 hours a day including waking night provision. This property will be available to the successful provider. Alternative premises within the borough will be considered, including slightly larger ones, up to 15 units.

#### The requirement

The service is a CQC registered residential care home for older people who are experiencing long-term, severe mental illness, including depression, anxiety, psychosis and personality disorder. In addition to supporting residents with their mental health needs, the service also supports residents with their physical care needs relating to pre-existing conditions or as a result of increasing age and frailty, including dementia in some cases. Residents may also present with challenging behaviours and dual diagnosis issues, such as alcohol misuse.

## **TUPE** [Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations]

Potential providers must be aware that TUPE may apply to this service. Further details will be available in the invitation to tender.

## **Contract Period**

The contract period will be for 48 months from an estimated start date of 01/12/2020 with two options to extend of up to 24 months each, meaning a potentional total extension of up to 48 months and a potential total contract length of up to 96 months.

#### **Contract Value**

The estimated total value of this contract is £4,186,776 over the maximum 96 months term of the contract. This is based on £523,347 per annum.

## Award criteria

The contract will be awarded to the Most Economically Advantageous Tender (MEAT) in accordance with the Public Contracts Regulations. MEAT for this contract is quality 70% and cost 30%. Further details will be provided in the invitation to tender.
