The authority is considering options for the future provision of bus shelters within Reading Borough, and wishes to appoint a contractor to supply, install, maintain and clean all of the advertising and non-advertising bus shelters along with associated street furniture. The contract will include a planned capital replacement programme of the existing 238 bus shelters located within the Borough, along with the re-installation of real time passenger information (RTPI) equipment and scheduled and emergency maintenance.

The contract will be primarily for the use of Reading Borough Council, but the Council may wish to extend its terms to other local authorities or public bodies within the Thames Valley Area (including Swindon) or the wider South East Region. Such other local authorities or public bodies would contract directly with the successful contractor.

Precise information on deadline(s) for lodging appeals: Reading Borough Council will incorporate a minimum 10 calendar days standstill period at the point information on the award of the contract is communicated to tenderers. This period allows unsuccessful tenderers to seek further debriefing from the contracting authority before the contract is entered into. Applicants have 2 working days from the notification of the award decision to request additional debriefing and that information has to be provided a minimum 3 working days before the expiry of the standstill period. Such additional information should be requested from address given at part I 1.3 of this notice. If an appeal regarding the award of a contract has not been successfully resolved the Public Contracts Regulations 2006 (SI 2006 No. 5) provide for aggrieved parties who have been harmed or are at risk of harm by breach of the rules to take action in the High Court (England, Wales and Northern Ireland). Any such action must be brought promptly (generally within 3 months). Where a contract has not been entered into the court may order the setting aside of the award decision or order the authority to amend any document and may award damages. If the contract has been entered into the court may only award damages.
