Islington Council invites suitable expressions of interest from suppliers to provide a Social Inclusion and Leisure Opportunities Service (Learning Disabilities).

Background

Our vision is for people with learning disabilities to lead safe, happy and meaningful lives.

The service will provide people with learning disabilities the opportunity to meet new people, make friends, develop relationships and have access to meaningful, age-appropriate activity that draws on their interests.

The service will identify those that need it most and act early to reduce social isolation by access to activities, information, and support.

The requirement

The service will work with people with learning disabilities to provide ready access to a range of community-based activities that are meaningful, age-appropriate and draw on peoples' interests.

The provider will:

- Build on the service user's strengths and develop their independent living skills.
- Collate and share good quality, accessible information about what activities, groups and leisure opportunities are available locally.
- Co-produce and run a programme of activities, groups and leisure opportunities for people with learning disabilities.
- Provide 1:1 support to people that need additional help in accessing the above.

Lots

This contract will not be split into lots to ensure a consistent service.

TUPE [Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations]

Contract Period

The contract period will be for 24 months from an estimated start date 06 January 2020 with two options to extend for a period of 12 months each (up to 24 months).

The estimated total value of this contract is £304,000 over the maximum 48-month term of the contract. This is based on £76,000 per annum.

There is a maximum fixed budget for this service of £304,000. Any bids over this amount will be disqualified.

Award criteria

The contract will be awarded to the Most Economically Advantageous Tender (MEAT) in accordance with the Public Contracts Regulations. MEAT for this contract is quality 80% and cost 20%. Further details will be provided in the invitation to tender.

Those who submit a tender and meet the minimum requirements will have their full tender, method statements and pricing evaluated.
