

2324-0351 Islington – Adults Early Intervention and Prevention 'Wellbeing¹' Service.

Islington Council invites innovative and dynamic providers, with a strong knowledge of the borough and local presence, to tender for the provision of the Adult Community Early Intervention and Prevention service. The Council is seeking to work with providers who are committed to faireness and share and promote the same CARE principles:

- Collaborative,
- Ambitious,
- Resourceful,
- Efficient.

We want to work with providers who are committed to ensuring Islington residents receive high quality early intervention and prevention support. The Council is proposing to secure a contract with a suitably qualified and experienced provider(s) to provide early intervention and prevention for adults. The Council welcomes single, consortia or lead provider bids. Details of how contracts will be awarded is explained within the procurement documentation.

Background

The Council is committed to early intervention and prevention. In 2023, the Council published the <u>Fairer Together strategy</u> for early intervention and prevention to meet local ambitions for a more equal future for our residents. It is important that residents are supported at the right time with the right level of support to build on their strengths and maximise resilience, creating a culture of self-help. Early intervention and prevention is the most effective way to improve outcomes for people at all ages. As outlined in our Fairer Together Strategy 'We cannot underestimate the power of making connections, both between residents and their communities, and between services to make sure that the resident experience is seamless.'

The requirement

The Service will provide a comprehensive proactive early intervention and prevention offer which provides information and advice; access to social interactions and community connectedness; and one-to-one enablement support. The service will support adults aged

18+ in Islington, with an emphasis on those aged 50+. The service will provide innovative solutions that align with local early intervention and prevention ambitions and maximise resources and links to connect people to the borough's existing rich and diverse Voluntary Community Sector offer.

Lots

This services contract is not being divided in to lots. A single contract is being sought to ensure a comprehensive service offer.

TUPE [Transfer of Undertakings (Protection of Employment) Regulations]

Potential providers must be aware that TUPE may or may not apply to this service. Further details will be available in the procurement documentation.

Contract Period

The contract will run for a period of 96 months. It is estimated that the contract will start on 1 October 2024 with a break clause option for the Council to terminate the contract by giving 12 months written notice to the service provider at any time after the end of the first year.

Contract Value

The total budget for this contract is estimated to be £3,493,280 for the total duration of the contract based on annual budget for the service of £436,660.

Award criteria

The contract(s) will be awarded to the Most Economically Advantageous Tender (MEAT) in accordance with the Public Contracts Regulations.

Procurement Process

As the value of the contract is above the threshold for wider advertising of the opportunity, a Contract Notice will be published on Contracts Finder and Find a Tender (FTS).

This procurement is being conducted in accordance with the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 (the PCR). The procurement is subject to the 'light-touch regime' under Section 7 Social and Other Specific Services of Part 2 of the PCR. Under Regulation 76 the Council is free to establish a procedure, provided that the procedure is sufficient to ensure compliance with the principles of transparency and equal treatment of economic operators (service providers) and is initiated by a contract notice. The procedure the council has designed is based on the open procedure. All economic operators (service providers) who successfully express an interest will automatically have access to the tender documents. Standard pre-selection questions will be part of the tender response and will need to be passed before evaluation of price and quality aspects.

Register your company free of charge via the London Tenders Portal.

Await acceptance. You will receive an email confirming your username and password.
